Seven Tongue Principles

- 1. A soft answer turns away wrath.
- a. A harsh word stirs up anger.
- b. A soft answer turns away wrath.
- 2. The wise man uses his tongue in a desirable way.
- a. A wise man will have a wise tongue.
- b. Words just gush out of a fool's mouth.
- 3. Words can be a source of strength and growth.
- a. A wholesome tongue is a tree of life.
- b. An evil tongue breaks the spirit.

- 4. Wise people share helpful facts.
- a. Wise people share helpful facts.
- b. Fools don't share helpful facts.

- b. A fool feeds on his folly.
- 6. Timely words are beneficial.
