1. Financial Principles

a. The poor are in a sad state.

b. Some sell their liberty to gratify their luxury. (MH)

1. A person should be careful before taking out a large loan.
2. He may become like a slave or a poor, oppressed person.
3. You may sell your liberty to gratify your luxury.
4. But, the lender also assumes a risk.

b. What is the description of a charitable man?

A charitable man –

1. looks for objects of charity
2. offers his assistance to others
3. has an eye that sees someone in misery
4. has a heart that responds with compassion
5. does not diminish the one in need

6. has a liberal hand
7. gives of his bread for those in need
8. would rather suffer personal want than see the poor perish
9. does not give “all” his bread
10. will be blessed

4. How do I deal with the scoffer?

a. What is a scoffer?

1. He is an abomination to mankind. *Prov 24:9*
2. He is proud and arrogant in his actions. *Prov 21:24*
3. He hates correction and the one who gives it. *Prov 9:7-8*
4. He can't find wisdom. *Prov 14:6*
5. His punishment is an example to the simple. *Prov 19:25; 21:11*
6. Discipline, not discussion, is how you deal with him. *Prov 19:29*

b. What should we do to the scoffer?

“cast out”

c. What will happen when we drive out the scoffer?

1. Brawling and quarrelling will be gone.
2. Strife will cease.
3. Shame, confusion, and dishonor will be gone.
